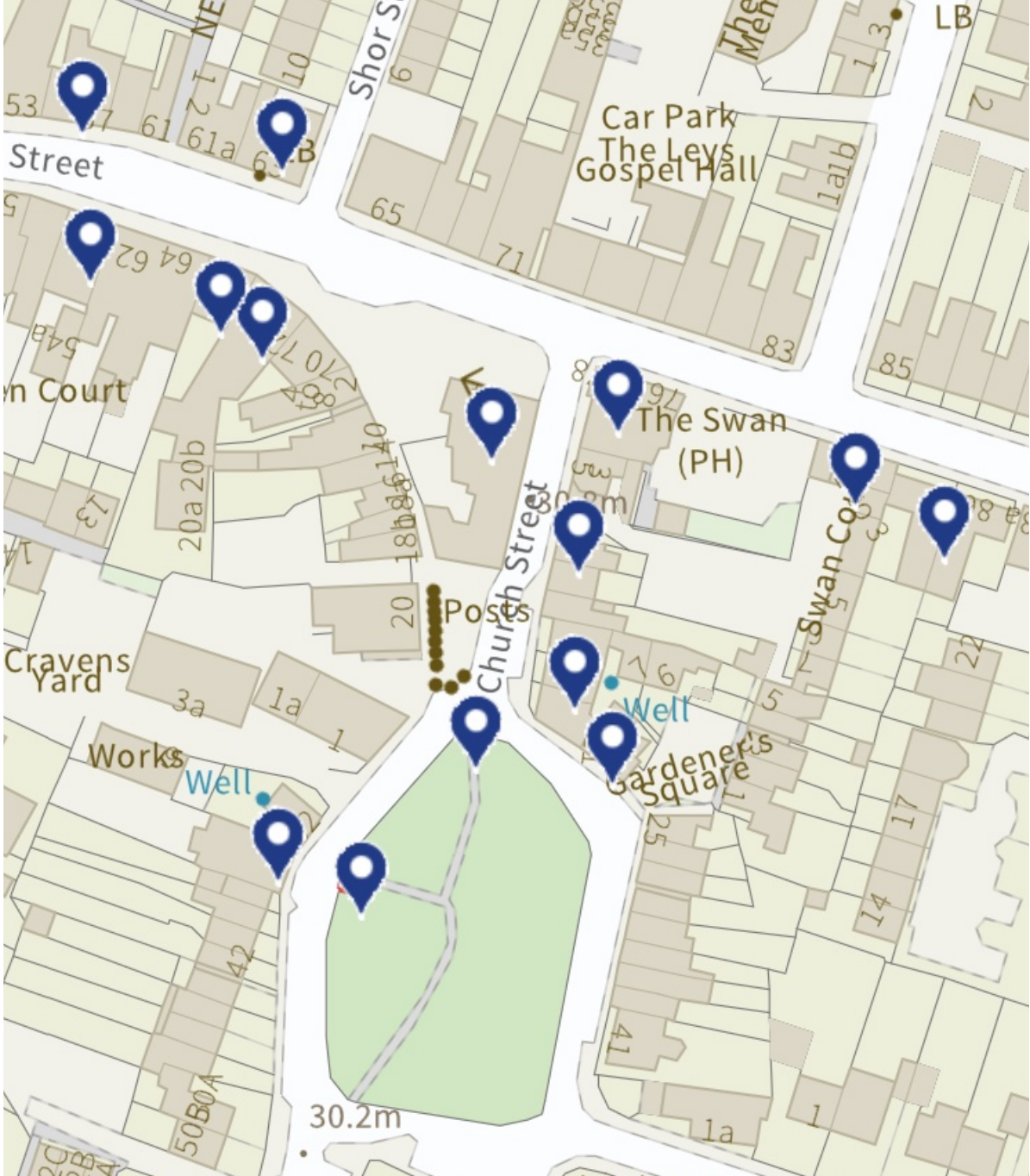

Address Gate Piers of Former Church of St Peter, Church Street

Grade II Date listed 24 June 1977.

Description:

*Probably C18. A pair of stone piers topped with carved truncated pinnacles.*

Address 32-34 Church Street

Grade II Date listed 24 June 1977.

### Description:

*Reputed to be of early medieval origin but with much later work and restoration. Formerly the Manor of Bengeworth and the home of the priors of Evesham Abbey. Originally the house was much larger and the present building, which is divided into 2 dwellings, was restored 1975 when good interior features were revealed. Rubble, partly cement rendered; 2 storeys and 2 storeys plus attic; gabled bay projects to street; modern tile roof. No 34 has 2 modern windows (with glazing bars), altered doorway with rectangular fanlight, bracketed weather hood and modern door. No 32 is the more interesting, having a massive lateral chimney base projecting to street and doorway on return side, which is probably C15 with massive iron-studded ledged door and early wrought iron knocker; windows generally modern and modern alterations at rear. Interior: (No 32). Good late C15 moulded ceiling beams in living room, a cusp-headed stoup set into the wall at 1st floor at side of present stairs, and a blocked Norman arch in rear wall at ground storey having zig-zag mouldings.*

Address 1-13 Church Street

Grade II

Date listed 23 June 1977

### Description:

*Early C19 terraced range of modest cottages. Red brick; 2 storeys. Each has a casement window with segmental head, and a plain doorway. Corbelled eaves; tiles. Included for group value.*

*Nos 1 to 13 (odd) forms a group with Nos 15 to 23 (odd) and The Swan Hotel, Port Street.*

Address 15-19 Church Street

Grade II

Date listed 23 June 1977

### Description:

*C18. A modest range of cottages. Painted brick; stone plinth; 2 storeys plus attic; 4 sash windows in broad cases, that to No 19 with altered glazing bars; band to Nos 17 and 19; doorways to Nos 15 and 17 have keyblocks, plain lintels and 4-flush-panelled; doorway to No 19 altered; 3 gabled dormers; tiles..*

*Nos 1 to 13 (odd) forms a group with Nos 15 to 23 (odd) and The Swan Hotel, Port Street.*

Address 21 & 23 Church Street

Grade II

Date listed 23 June 1977

### Description:

*C18. A pair of modest cottages with later alterations. Modern roughcast; 2 storeys plus attic; 2 C19 casement windows with segmental heads; 2 modern doorways with segmental heads; 2 gabled dormers; tiles. Included for group value.*

*Nos 1 to 13 (odd) forms a group with Nos 15 to 23 (odd) and The Swan Hotel, Port Street.*

### Description:
