Address 1 Merstow Green

Grade II

Date listed 7 May 1952

Description:

C16. Timber frame and painted cement; 2 storeys; slight overhang at 1st floor; 2 modern casement windows (with glazing bars); plain eaves; gabled dormer (obscured); tiles. Modern multi-paned shop front.

Nos 1 to 7 (consec) and Old Grammar School form a group with Nos 16 and 17 Vine Street.

Address 2 and 4 Merstow Place

Grade II

Date listed 24 June 1977

Description:

Probably early C16 but now much altered. Stone, faced in stucco; 2 storeys; band; pseudo-quoins at sides; 2 modern casement windows each, replacing former sashes; altered doorways with modern doors; tiles. Interior has exposed ceiling beams and each has a plain C18 staircase, that to No 4 in modern panelling.

Address 4,5,6 Merstow Green formerly listed as 5 and 6.

Grade II

Date listed 24 June 1977

Description:

Early C19. Painted brick and engraved stucco; two storeys; five sash windows (single glazing bars only), those to No 6 in plain surrounds; plain eaves; tiles and slates. Modern doorways and shop fronts. Included for group value.

Nos 1 to 7 (consec) and Old Grammar School form a group with Nos 16 and 17 Vine Street.

Address 7 Merstow Green formerly listed as 5 and 6.

Grade II

Date listed 24 June 1977

Description:

Probably C18 or earlier and with modern alterations. Painted brick; 2 storeys; one sash window, and one modern casement to ground storey (with glazing bars); plain segmental-headed doorway with modern door; modillion eaves; Cotswold stone roof, hipped on left-hand side.

Nos 1 to 7 (consec) and Old Grammar School form a group with Nos 16 and 17 Vine Street.

Address 14 Merstow Green

Grade II

Date listed 7 May 1952 amended 24 June 1977

Description:

C16. Restored and with some modern alterations. Timber frame with close set vertical members, and painted cement infilling; 2 storeys; slightly projecting gabled bay on left-hand side (2 windows) has 2 overhangs and coved overhang to gable; 4 renewed sash windows overall; central doorway with restored wood segmental head; restored brick stacks; tiles. Stone gabled end on west side. Timber-framed wing at rear formerly Nos 1 to 3 (consec) and No 6 Trumpet Yard.

Address 15-17 Merstow Green

Grade II

Date listed 7 May 1952

Description:

C18. Red brick; 3 storeys; 4 sash windows (one blocked) with keyblocks and shaped plain lintels; 3-light windows to ground storey and moulded wood doorcases with traceried fanlights (one obscured); parapet. No 17 is a smaller attached house having one sash window, plain doorway with modern door, modillion eaves, and slate roof.

Nos 14 to 21 (consec) form a group.

Grade II

Date listed 24 June 1977

Description:

Early-mid C19. Red brick; 2 storeys; 2 sash window and plain doorways, all in plain surrounds, the latter with semi-circular heads and plain fanlights; slates. Included for group value.

Nos 14 to 21 (consec) form a group.

Grade II

Date listed 24 June 1977

Description:

Early C19. Engraved cement; 2 storeys; 2 sash windows and a plain doorway, all in plain surrounds, modern door; parapet. Later C19 shop front to No 20 (with glazing bars). Included for group value.

Date listed 24 June 1977

Description:

Early C19 modest cottage. Red brick; 2 storeys; 2 sash windows with segmental arches; plain doorway with ledged door; dog-tooth eaves; tiled. Unoccupied (1976). Included for group value.

Address 42 Merstow Green

Grade II

Date listed 24 June 1977

Description:

Early C19. Red brick; 2 storeys; 2 sash windows (plus one blocked) with flat brick arches; semi-circular headed doorway with radial fanlight and later door; former shop window with fluted pilasters at sides; hipped slate roof.

Nos 41 to 43 (consec) form a group.

Grade II

Date listed 29 June 1973 amended 24 June 1977

Description:

Early-mid C19. Red brick; 2 storeys; 3 sash windows with keyblocks and plain lintels, the window to right of 1st storey replaced by modern casement; central doorway with semi-circular head, plain fanlight and modern door; dog-tooth eaves; slates.

Nos 41 to 43 (consec) form a group.

Address Abbey Gate House listed as 53 and 54 Merstow Green

Grade **I** Date listed 7 May 1952

Description:

1711. Fine L-shaped house which incorporates the remains of the early C14 Abbey Gate, or Great Gate, built by Abbot Chyryton. House of stone and rubble; two storeys; six rush windows; two later C18 doorways with fanlights, 3/4 fluted Doric columns and cornices; wood modillion eaves cornice; hipped tile roof. Good moulded lead rainwater head on east side (of No 54), which is largely of medieval origin and has numerous blocked openings including large semi-circular arches, that at rear of No 53 being part of Abbey Gate and incorporating one original jamb.

Interior: No 54 largely altered, but No 53 has late C17 staircase and panelling. Bay on right-hand side projecting towards Merstow Green has a modern upper storey built above the gateway passage with an archway on north return side. To south of this bay, adjoining the Abbey Stables (qv) is the remains of a vaulted passage of early C14.

Address Gate and Railings at 53 Merstow Green

Grade **I** Date listed 24 June 1977

Description:

Early C18. Good wrought iron gate and railings fronting No 53, which is the right-hand portion of Abbey Gate House. The gate is set in the return to north.

Nos 53 and 54 incorporating Remains of Abbey Gate, Gate and railings of No 53, Remains of Abbey Stables, the Almonry and The Stocks, together with Nos 4 and 5 Abbey Gate and Remains of south wall of Abbey Precinct, Little Abbey Lane, form a group with Church of All Saints, Church of St Lawrence, The Bell Tower, Abbot Reginald's Wall and The Porter's Lodge, Remains of west wall of North Transept of Abbey, Archway to south of the Remains of the west wall of the North Transept of Abbey, Abbot Reginald's Gateway and The Old Vicarage, the Public Library, Nos 6 and 6A, Nos 7 and 8 and Walker Hall, Market Place.

Address The Almonry

Grade

I

Date listed 7 May 1952

Description:

C15 and earlier building of the Benedictine Abbey. Partly rubble, partly timber frame. The left-hand portion of rubble and probably of C14 origin, has buttresses at sides, gable, and a C17 four-light mullioned window with hood mould. Centre has rubble base with close-set timber framing above, five-light wood mullioned window having leaded lights, and two windows in chamfered reveals. Right-hand bay timber-framed, with oversailing upper storey and gable with carved barge-boards; also a three-light oriel with renewed leaded lights. Cotswold stone roof. The building well restored throughout and now The Almonry Museum containing items of local and rural interest and numerous relics of the Abbey.

Address The Stocks

Grade II

Date listed 7 May 1952

Description:

Medieval wood stocks which formerly stood in the Market Place. Modern Cotswold-tiled canopy and iron railings.

Nos 53 and 54 incorporating Remains of Abbey Gate, Gate and railings of No 53, Remains of Abbey Stables, the Almonry and The Stocks, together with Nos 4 and 5 Abbey Gate and Remains of south wall of Abbey Precinct, Little Abbey Lane, form a group with Church of All Saints, Church of St Lawrence, The Bell Tower, Abbot Reginald's Wall and The Porter's Lodge, Remains of west wall of North Transept of Abbey, Archway to south of the Remains of the west wall of the North Transept of Abbey, Abbot Reginald's Gateway and The Old Vicarage, the Public Library, Nos 6 and 6A, Nos 7 and 8 and Walker Hall, Market Place.
